# Questions

### Arrival/Dismissal?

This is a BIG challenge and a REVISED logistical plan was shared on Wednesday, April 21st. We thank you for your continued patience! FABULOUS JOB, "Crew!"

#### **Transportation?**

There are no changes to transportation availability for the remainder of the school year. If you are currently eligible, you continue to have transportation daily. There were minimal changes to bus numbers/routes; *letters were distributed Friday, April 16th.* 

#### **Schedule Changes?**

Yes, everyone's schedule has been revised in some way! *Information was shared April 16th*, *19th*, *20th and by teachers*.

#### **Hours?**

The instructional day remains 8:45 AM - 3:15 PM. Students may have scheduled classes remotely during the afternoon hours. Schedules may also include asynchronous, or independent, assignments and activities. Students have a four hours of synchronous/asynchronous instruction daily with some variance due to specials.

### **Special Education?**

There were some changes to related services' programming which was communicated! Individualized schedules were shared the week of April 19th and continue to be tweaked.

# Questions

#### Snack?

Snack in classrooms is staggered to accommodate six feet distancing OR outside six feet apart. Please have your child bring a beach towel for outside snack!

#### **Homeroom Changes?**

We minimized homeroom changes to the greatest extent possible while accommodating individual students' programming, the return of remote students, class sizes for health and safety, and personal circumstances. There was also the constraint of limited classroom availability. *Communications were distributed Friday, April 16th.* 

#### **Remote Students?**

Remote students continue to work as a cohort, but will share grade level teachers in some grades. Their schedules may also utilize the full school day (8:45-3:15).

Remote students rotate grade level teachers by subject in K, 2, 3, and 4. We continue to have two remote sections in grade 1, so they will run similarly to how they have under the hybrid schedule. Grades 5 & 6 remain departmentalized and have instruction throughout the full school day.

Our numbers of remote students dropped from ~20% to NOW <10%! But we have cohorts at every grade level.

General schedule letters were distributed on April 19th.

# Instruction & Programming 2021-2022

- Maintaining All Staff & Programs
- An Additional Special Education Teacher
- Expanding BSI Support through Scheduling
- Increasing the LDTC (CST) from 3.0 days to 4.0 days
- Adding Supplies & Materials (as our 4 4th grade sections move to 5th)
- Continuing to Support Our Instructional Initiatives
  - Utilize ESSERII funding for SEL-Mental Health Support and Assessment/Academic Resources, including professional development and SEL
  - (Continue to) Utilize ESEA Title funding for literacy, SEL, professional development, inclusivity training, parent support, and related materials





## Transportation

We will continue to follow state, federal, and DOH recommendations pertaining to social distancing.

If everything is "normal", **our goal is to reinstate courtesy busing**. Courtesy busing is actually less \$\$ than every day, mandated, socially distanced busing.

Our goal is busing every day for all students.





# Additional Annual Allocations and their Impacts on the 2021-22 Budget

- Salary Increases (Currently negotiating Budgeted 3%)
- Health Care Cost Increases
  - $\circ$  Medical +7%
  - $\circ$  Dental +3%
  - $\circ$  Rx +0%
- Increase in Liability Insurance (+10%)
- Increase in Workers Compensation Costs (+6%)

Additional State Aid of ~\$88.5k has been allocated to SE Staffing & Transportation 23





# Proposed Inclusions Maintenance Projects

These are all part of the Board approved M-1 Maintenance Plan

- Repairs and Inspections to the Roof and Skylights
- Univent Maintenance & Safety Inspections
- Inspections and Repairs to Play Scapes & Swings
- Asbestos Maintenance and Repairs
- Maintenance and Repairs to Boiler System
- Repairs to Brick Face & Fascia on Building

If projects are completed for less than estimated, funds are returned to the Maintenance Reserve Account for use in subsequent years' Maintenance Projects. 24

(Capital Reserve - not part of the tax levy)


These are all Strategic and Long Range Facilities Plans!
